Inside The Numbers

Aside from a hard right hand that stunned Teraji at the end of round four, the multi-time light flyweight champion dominated the bout with his footwork, speed, jabbing and accuracy until the fight was stopped by the ringside physician seconds into an 11th round in which no punches were thrown. A sharp right hand to the nose in round three bloodied Rosales' nose and the crimson continued to flow for the remainder of the match. Rosales was more active (48.4 punches per round to Teraji's 42.9) but the huge accuracy gaps (41%-14% overall, 34%-6% jabs, 54%-22% power) resulted in final margins of 177-68 overall, 95-16 jabs, 51-26 body, 82-52 power and 10-0 in the CompuBox round-by-round breakdown of total connects. Interestingly, the 10th round was Rosales' best in terms of total connects (14, the only time he reached double-digits) while Teraji topped 20 four times, with 29 in round three being his best. A marvelous all-around performance for Teraji, who won the vacant WBC flyweight title.
