Inside The Numbers

Leo retained the IBF featherweight title for the first time by outpointing former WBO bantamweight champion Kameda in Kameda's hometown of Osaka. Leo did so by being much more active (53 punches per round to Kameda's 28.3) and by beginning and ending most of the skirmishes. He also employed much more long-range boxing instead of his usual body-blasting aggression, though he led 55-43 in landed body shots. Kameda, who was more accurate overall (25%-21%) and in power shots (33%-32%) won his rounds by being the man moving forward, but the work rate difference favoring Leo ultimately proved decisive. Leo ended the fight ahead 135-86 overall, 44-11 jabs, 91-75 power and 11-1 in the CompuBox round-by-round breakdown of total connects, but the fighters were separated by three or fewer total connects in five of the 12 rounds, which, along with Kameda's home ring advantage, could explain the closer-than-reality scorecards.
